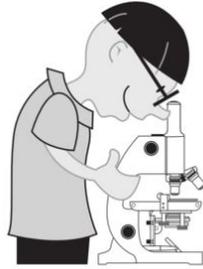



Saying what you can and must do



infinitive	il / elle / on he / she / you (general)/we	ils / elles they
pouvoir to be able to (can)	peut	peuvent
devoir to have to (must)	doit	doivent

Use the modal verbs *devoir* and *pouvoir* with an infinitive to say what you can and must do.



Talking about a school day [3 /3]

1. "Passer un examen" =	to sit an exam
2. "On doit" means =	we have to/we must
3. In French, they have to =	ils/elles doivent
4. In French, they can =	ils/elles peuvent
5. "Propre" can translate as "clean", but if it's before the noun it means means =	own
