Emphatic pronouns



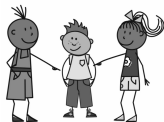
We use emphatic pronouns after prepositions like 'avec', 'pour', 'sans' and 'chez', to emphasise the person speaking, or to answer a question about ourselves or someone else.



moi - Me



toi - You



lui/elle - Him/her

nous - Us



vous - You (pl)



eux/elles - Them

Talking about relationships



We use emphatic pronouns:

- 1) With the words avec (with), pour (for), sans (without) and chez (at _____'s house).
- 2) When we want to emphasise the subject of a sentence (e.g. me, I love cake).
- 3) When we are answering a question about ourselves or others.
