Tu peux - You (specific) can



II peut - He can



Elle peut - She can



On peut - You (general) can



Pouvoir - to be able to

Use **pouvoir** with an infinitive to say what you can do:

Je peux faire la grasse matinée.



I can have a lie in.

Je peux aller en ville.



I can go to town.



Vouloir - to want





Je veux- I want



Tu v**eux** - You (specific) want



Il veut - He wants



Elle v**eut** - She wants



On veut - You (general) want



Vouloir

- to want

Je veux = I want



To refer to what you want to do

Pouvoir

- to be able to

Je peux = I can



To refer to what you can do



Devoir - to have to/must





Je doi**s**- I must/have to



Tu doi**s** - You (specific) must / have to



Il doi**t** - He must / has to



Elle doi**t** - She must / has



On doi**t** - You (general) must/have to



Savoir - to know (how to)





Je sai**s**- I know



Il sai**t** - He knows



Elle sai**t** - She knows



Tu sai**s** - You (specific)



On sai**t** - You (general) know
