llevar	to take, taking/ to carry, carrying
bajar	to go down, going down
subir	to go up, going up
el regalo	gift
a gusto	comfortable, content
triste	sad
fuerte	strong
a pie	by foot



The future tense

To form the future tense in Spanish with regular verbs, start with the infinitive:

e.g. Comprar

to buy, buying

Then add an ending depending on who is doing the action.

For I, add 'é'

For **s/he/it** add '**a**'

e.g. Compraré

I will buy

e.g. Comprará

He/She/It will buy
