

Grammaire

Using modal verbs + infinitive



Devoir

- to have to / must

Je dois = I must, have to



To refer to what you **must** do

Pouvoir

- to be able to

Je peux = I can




To refer to what you **can** do



Devoir - to have to / must

Use **devoir** with an infinitive to say what you must do:

Je dois rester chez moi.



I must stay at home.

Je dois faire les magasins.



I must go shopping.



Pouvoir - to be able to

Use **pouvoir** with an infinitive to say what you can do:

Je peux faire la grasse matinée.



I can have a lie in.

Je peux aller en ville.



I can go to town.
