

Using the near future - we & they

To talk about **what we're going to do** we use the correct part of the verb 'ir' ('**vamos**') followed by 'a' and an **infinitive**.

Vamos a llevar ropa de calle.



We are going to wear non-uniform clothes.

To talk about **what they're going to do** we use the correct part of the verb 'ir' ('**van**') followed by 'a' and an **infinitive**.

Van a comer churros.



They are going to eat churros.



Using idiomatic phrases with 'ir de'

We use 'ir' followed by the preposition 'de' in some idiomatic expressions.

ir de compras *to go shopping*

paseo *to go for a walk*

visit *to visit*

tapas *to go round the bars and have some tapas*

fiesta *to go out (night out/party)*

Remember to use the correct form of the verb (to go → ir).
