La fonética

The vowel [u] **merges** with [a], [e] and [o] to make a single syllable. This is a 'weak' vowel.

| dividir | to divide, dividing |
| permitir | to allow, allowing |
| decidir | to decide, deciding |





Using the 'we' form of -IR verbs

Remember, some Spanish infinitives end in -ir.

The verb ending changes depending on who the verb refers to.

To mean 'I' with an -ir verb, remove -ir and add ____.

To mean 'we' with an -ir verb, remove -ir and add -imos.



Using the 'they' form of -iR verbs

To say 'they' do an action in the present tense, remove the -ER from the infinitive and add <u>-en</u>.

Permiten juegos.

They allow games.

How would you change the following?

cubrir — c

cubr**en** (they cover)

- 2. The ending for IR present tense verbs in the 'they' form is: en
- 3. 'Cubrimos el costo' means: 'we cover the cost'.
