The passive with singular subjects

Use the past (preterite) passive to say what **was done** to something or someone. To form it, use the preterite tense of **ser**, followed by the **past participle**.

The past participle must agree in gender and number with the subject.

The cake was eaten by Daniela.

El pastel fue comido por Daniela.

The biscuit was eaten by Jaime.

La galleta fue comida por Jaime.



The passive with plural subjects

With more than one thing, use the 'they' form preterite **fueron**, followed by the past participle.

The past participle must agree in gender and number with the subject.

The cakes were eaten by Daniela.

Los pasteles fueron comidos por Daniela.

The biscuits were eaten by Jaime.

Las galletas fueron comidas por Jaime.
