voyager/visiter d'autres pays	to travel/visit other countries
faire un apprentissage	to do an apprenticeship
continuer mes études à la faculté	to continue my studies at university
faire du bénévolat	to do voluntary work
me marier/me pacser	to get married/register a civil partnership
avoir des enfants	to have children
m'installer avec mon copain/ma copine	to move in with my boy/girlfriend

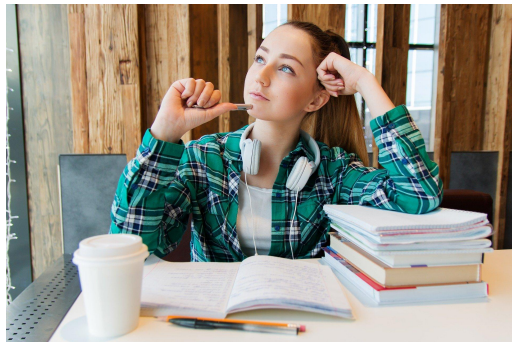


Remember, the infinitive can also be translated by the gerund. Example: faire = to do/doing



Using si clauses

Si je travaille beaucoup, je continuer**ai** mes études à la faculté.



If I work a lot, **I will continue** my studies at university.



Using si clauses

Si je travaille**e** beaucoup, je continuer**ai** mes études à la faculté.

If + **present tense** , + **simple future**

To form 'si clauses' using the present and simple future, 'si' is followed by the present tense, and the verb in the simple future tense follows the comma.
