participer à la vie en société	To participate in society
rencontrer de nouvelles personnes	To meet new people
les sans-abri / les SDF	homeless people
les enfants	children
enrichissant	rewarding

The infinitive  
can also be  
translated by  
the gerund.

**Travailler** = **to**  
work AND  
**working**



- There are three direct object pronouns in French:  
**le, la, and les.**



Je déteste **le chocolat**



Je **le** déteste

Je déteste **les**



Je **les** déteste

Je déteste **la tarte au citron**



Je **la** déteste

When the verb starts with a  
**vowel** or silent [h], **le** and **la**  
become **l'**

The **direct object pronoun** is placed between the **subject** of the sentence (in this case the word for I) and the **verb**



# Replacing ideas or concepts - infinitive phrases

J'aime travailler avec les SDF



Je **l'aime**  
= I like it

J'aime travailler avec les SDF



Je **le** trouve enrichissant  
= I find it rewarding

This can add **complexity** to our work and help to **avoid repetition**.
