



The perfect tense

J'**ai travaillé** au collège
I **(have) worked** at school



The perfect tense refers to one completed action in the past.

The present tense

Je jou**e** au foot
I **play**/I **am playing** football



The **present tense** refers to what we do or are doing right now.





The perfect tense

The perfect tense in French is how we say 'I have ____'. It is made up of a **subject pronoun**, an **auxiliary verb**, and a **past participle**.

J'ai travaillé au collège



I (have) worked at school

Tu as travaillé au collège



You (have) worked at school

Il a travaillé au collège



He (has) worked at school

Elle a travaillé au collège



She (has) worked at school

On a travaillé au collège



We (have) worked at school



The present tense

The present tense is how we talk about what we do, or are doing, now. To form the present tense of an -er verb, remove the -er and add the

present tense ending.

Je travaille**e** au collège



I work/am working at school

Tu travailles**es** au collège



You work/are working at school

Il travaille**e** au collège



He works/is working at school

Elle travaille**e** au collège



She works/is working at school


