The superlative

When we mean ‘the **least / most** ...’, we use the superlative.

In Spanish, we structure the superlative like this.

The adjective usually goes after the noun and agrees with it:

el (los)		problema(s)	más		difícil/es
la (las)		idea(s)	menos		serio/a/os/as
		(noun)			(adjective)

the		problem(s)	most		difficult
		idea(s)	least		serious



The superlative

Some superlatives are formed differently and the adjectives go in front of the noun:

el/la/los/as	+	mejor peor mayor menor	+	problema solución amigo/a (noun)
--------------	---	---------------------------------	---	--

the	+	best worst greatest smallest	+	problem solution friend
-----	---	---------------------------------------	---	-------------------------------



The superlative

Examples:

El paro **es el peor problema** global.

Unemployment is **the worst** worldwide **problem**.

In Spanish,
use the
article, here.



The superlative

In Spanish, to mean '**the best/worst thing, meaning a general idea**', use the article 'lo':

Lo



mejor
peor

The



best
worst

thing



The superlative

This also applies to when we say in Spanish '**the most/least (worrying/interesting/shocking/serious) thing**':

Lo



más
menos

preocupante
interesante
chocante
serio

most
least



worrying
interesting
shocking
serious

thing

5. To mean 'the most worrying thing', use lo más preocupante.
