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Developing Language for Telling Stories - Picture sequences

Gather up as many pictures of the child's day to day activities or events for this kind of task. Retell the event and write notes for each picture.

Increase the amount of time between events and sequencing/retelling them!

Reduce the number of pictures needed to give detail about the event.



Developing Language for Telling Stories - Retelling Stories

Read stories together and talk about:

Who is in the story?

Where did it take place?

What happened ... what happened next?

When?

Draw out some pictures of these key parts of the story.

Act out parts and bring key concepts to life with sensory activities!

Use these pictures to retell the story in as much detail as possible.
