## Secondary chords

In a major key, there are always 3 chords that are minor. These are chords 2, 3 and 6 and they are called the **secondary chords.**

## **Chord progressions**

- A chord progression is the same as a chord sequence. It is a repeated set of chords.
- Chord progressions often use a mix of primary and secondary chords.
- A song might use more than one chord progression.
