Lesson introduction

In this lesson, we will be working through the steps to create a fashion show poster.



Making a fashion poster

Posters can be used to advertise events.

We are going to make a poster for a fashion show.

First copy the poster writing frame onto the paper using your pencil and ruler.

What is the show called?
Where?
When?
How much are tickets?

What do you want to call the fashion show?
What is the focus? Hats, scarves, shoes?

Think of a fun name including your favourite
item of clothing.
E.g. 'Hats Hats Everywhere!'

Making a fashion poster

Where will the fashion show take place?

The garden? The living room?

When will it take place? Can you write a day of the week?

Making a fashion poster

Now you have added the information to your poster, it is time to decorate it.

Use the magazines to find images of clothes or accessories you like.

Cut them out and glue them onto the poster.

Remember the name of your fashion show!



Make it easier

Use symbols to support the learner.

Adult makes a poster alongside the learner.

Make it harder

Give the learner more choices.

Ask the learner what about different fashion items. When will you wear this? Winter? Summer?

More ideas

Make a fashion magazine by taking photos or using magazines. Choose images and then comment on them. What colour is the coat?
