

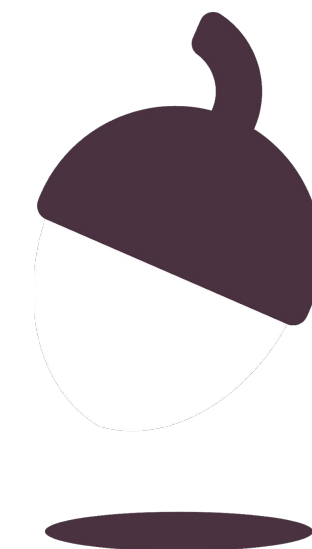

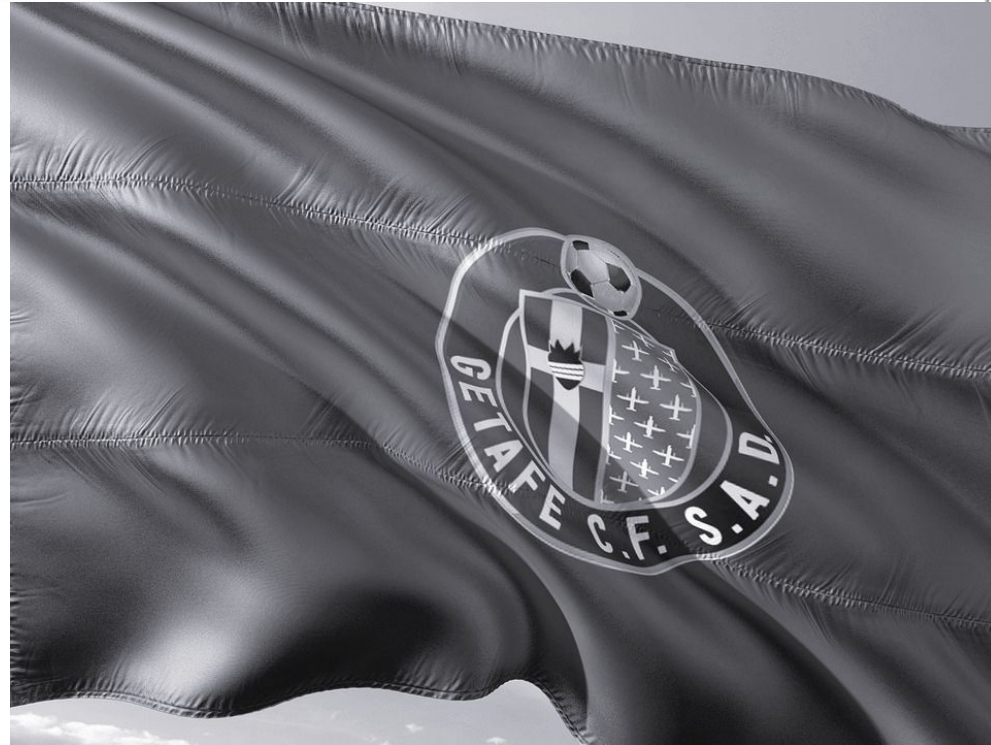

Comparisons

When comparing two things against each other, we can use 'mejor' and 'peor'.

El cantante español es **mejor** que el cantante inglés.

The Spanish singer is better than the English singer.

El cantante español es **peor** que el cantante inglés.

The Spanish singer is worse than the English singer.



Adjectival agreement

Remember, in Spanish, adjectives can have different endings depending whether the noun they are describing is masculine or feminine.

Adjective endings also change in the plural.

Masculine singular	Feminine singular	Masculine plural	Feminine plural
nuevo o	nueva a	nuev os	nuev as
interesante e	interesante e	interesant es	interesant es
útil l	útil l	útil es	útil es



Summary

1. To say 'better' in Spanish, use the word 'mejor'
2. To say 'worse' in Spanish, use the word 'peor'.
3. 'que' means '*than*'
4. Translate: "es peor que" It is worse than
5. Translate: "The computer is better than the mobile"
