

Perfect tense with haben

To use the past tense you need <u>TWO</u> parts: a form of **haben** in the present tense and a **past participle**

Part One:

ich habe I have

er/sie/es hat he/she/it has

wir haben we have

You will have seen and used haben a lot already.



Perfect tense with haben




Part two

You now need a past participle, this must go at the <u>end of the sentence</u> (not like in English)


To form a <u>regular</u> past participle:

- 1. take the en off the infinitive of the verb
- 2. add a T
- 3. add a 'GE' to the front
- 4. now you have a past participle

Beware of irregular past participles. Can you name any?









Remember you need the present tense of haben and the past participle begins with 'ge' and ends with 't'

Form of haben and a past participle

gespielt / gehört/ gemacht / gefaulenzt

At the end of the sentence

Take the infinitive, take off the **en**, add **t** to the end and **ge** to the beginning

Ich habe Rindersteak mit Pommes gekauft, es war lecker.
