

Task 1: How did the UK become so diverse?

- 1. **43-410 AD: Romans invaded**, bringing the **first black people to Britain** with them from North Africa and others.
- 2. **1555-1833:** African and Afro-Caribbean people arrived because of Britain's involvement in the **slave trade.**
- 3. **1946-1971 Windrush:** Thousands of Caribbean migrants filled vacant UK jobs increasing the diversity of the existing black Afro and Afro-Caribbean community.
- 4. 1840: Many people came to England to escape a terrible famine in Ireland.
- 5. **1972 to Present Day:** Immigrants continue to arrive from the **EU** and **around the world,** adding to the diversity of our country.
- 6. During the **Second World War (1939-1945)**, immigration increased due to people fleeing persecution by the Nazis.
- 7. **1700 onwards:** Indians and Chinese arrived because of Britain's growing Empire and trade with far off countries.
- 8. **From 1945-1971:** Commonwealth migration began due to jobs shortages post WW2. This led to many communities from the Caribbean, India parts of Africa migrating to the UK.
