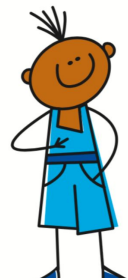
# Regular -er verbs

To form the present tense with a regular ER verb.

1. Remove the ER from the infinitive
2. Add the correct ending.



Parl**er** - To speak



**Je** parl**e** - I speak



**Tu** parl**es** - You speak



**Nous** parl**ons** - We speak



**Vous** parl**ez** - You speak



**Ils** parl**ent** - They speak
