( <i>his</i> ) <i>verbis</i>	with (these) words	( <i>primo</i> ) hour	in/on/at the (first)
<i>igni</i>	with fire	<i>illo tempore</i>	at that time
<i>magna cura</i>	with great care	( <i>prima</i> ) luce	at (first) light/dawn
<i>magna voce</i>	with/in a great voice	( <i>media</i> ) nocte	at (mid)night
