


Devoir - have to / must (irregular verb)

Tu doi**s** = You must, have



To refer to one specific person

On doi**t** = You must, have to



To refer to people in general

Use **devoir** with an infinitive to say what someone must do:

Tu doi**s** fai**re** de l'exercice = You (specific) must do some exercise.

On doi**t** fai**re** de l'exercice = You (general) must do some exercise.



Pour

The word pour has two meanings in French.

Je vais aller **pour** deux semaines =

I am going to go for two weeks

Pour rester en forme...

=

(In order) to stay in shape

- 1. The verb devoir means have to / must
- 2. I must = je dois
- 3. You (specific) must = tu dois
- 4. You (general) must = on doit
- 5. The verb devoir is followed by the infinitive
- 6. This form of the verb ends in er, ir, re
