In German there are several ways to make plural forms of nouns.

Most masculine and neuter words either:

1. add **-e** to the end

90% of masculine plurals work like this.











or


2. add -e to the end + an umlaut on the vowel.



3. Some masculine and neuter nouns also add **-er** to the end **+ an umlaut** on the vowel.







das Buch

die Bücher



Words ending in **-el** or **-en** or **-er** are often **the same** in the plural:

















Feminine nouns:

add -n or -en to the end


















Nouns borrowed from English or another language add an **-s** 





Note that the word for 'the' is 'die' for ALL plural nouns!



### Summary of our learning

Most masculine and neuter nouns add an <b>-e</b> to the end, eg. (magazines) or add an <b>-e</b> and an umlaut on the vowel.
