#### **GUSTAR-TYPE VERBS**

To say 'I like' in Spanish we say: <u>me gusta</u>.

'Me gusta' comes from the verb 'gustar' which means: to be pleasing to.

With gustar-type verbs we use an <u>indirect object pronoun</u> to show who likes what.

me La ciudad me gusta = the city is pleasing to me (to me)

le La ciudad le gusta = the city is pleasing to him/her. (he/she likes the city)



#### Here are more verbs that work in the same way:

encantar - to love (literally 'to enchant')

Me encanta = I love (it)
Le encanta = He/she loves (it)

If you don't explicitly state the subject (e.g. the city) then you mean 'it' or you are referring back to something already mentioned.

interesar - to interest

For emphasis or if it's otherwise unclear, you can add 'a mí' or 'a él/ella' at the start of the sentence, too.

Me interesa = (It) interests me Le interesa = (It) interests him/her



#### Warning!

The following verbs work like other verbs you know:

```
Odio
Pienso
Prefiero
Quiero
Suelo

I hate
I think
I prefer
I want
I usually
```

These verbs do not need indirect object pronouns (e.g., 'me' or 'le').
