

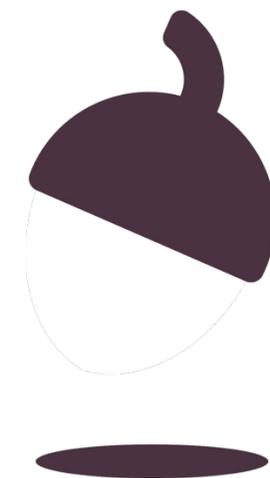





Making a sentence negative in English



I speak



I **don't** speak

Add **don't before** the verb



Making a sentence negative in French



Je parle



Je **ne** parle **pas**

Add **ne** and **pas** **before** and **after** the verb



Making a sentence negative in French



Je écoute



J'écoute



Je **ne** écoute **pas**



Je **n'** écoute **pas**

***ne* changes to *n'* before a verb starting with a vowel.**



Using savoir and connaître


savoir = to know/knowing



The verb 'savoir' means:

- **To know how to do something**
- **To know a fact**

connaître = to know/knowing



The verb 'connaître' means:

- **To know (be familiar with) a place, person, thing.**




Using savoir and connaître

Je **sais parler** français.



I **know how** to speak French.

Je **connais** Pierre - il est français.



I **know** Pierre. He is French.




Savoir - to know how to do something

Use **savoir** with an infinitive to say what you **know how to do** :

Je sais jouer au tennis



I know **how** to play tennis


Tu sais parler l'anglais?



Do you know **how** to speak English?




Savoir - to know (how to)




Je sais - I know




Tu sais - You (specific)
know



Il sait - He knows



Elle sait - She knows



On sait - You (general)
know



Connaître - to know (of/about)


Use **connaître** with what you **know of/about** or are **familiar with**:

Je connais Londres



I **know** London
I'm **familiar** with London


Tu connais mon ami Pierre?



Do you **know** my friend Pierre?




Connaître - to know (of/about)




Je **connais**- I know




Tu **connais** - You
(specific) know



Il **connaît** - He knows



Elle **connaît** - She knows



On **connaît** - You
(general) know



Talk in the negative (Part 1/2)

1 I don't know how to... =

je ne sais pas

2 He doesn't know London =

il ne connaît pas Londres

3 We don't see =

nous ne voyons pas

4 She doesn't listen =

elle n'écoute pas

5 You (pl.) don't see the beach =

vous ne voyez pas la plage
