What is being “**verb-ed**”

I am wearing **a shirt**.

We are meeting **my friend**.

They are eating **biscuits**.

**The things being  
“verb-ed”, therefore  
accusative case.**



# What's the accusative case?

The **object** of the sentence.

What is being “**verb-ed**”

You need to know  
the gender of the  
noun.

Masculine	Feminine	Neuter	Plural
einen	eine	ein	meine

Ich habe **einen** Hund.

Ich trage **eine** Krawatte.

Er hat **ein** Kaninchen.

Sie sieht **meine** Freunde.



# Accusative adjective endings

If the adjective comes **before** the noun it describes, you need to add an ending.

Masculine	Feminine	Neuter	Plural
<b>einen (-en)</b>	<b>eine (-e)</b>	<b>ein (-es)</b>	<b>meine (-en)</b>

The adjective endings are in brackets.

Ich habe **einen** kleinen Hund.

Ich trage **eine** gestreifte Krawatte.

Er hat **ein** faules Kaninchen.

Sie sieht **meine** besten Freunde.

I have a small dog.

I'm wearing a striped tie.

He has a lazy rabbit.

She's seeing my best friends.



# Accusative adjective endings:

1. The **accusative** case is used for the object of the sentence.
2. If the adjective comes **before** the noun it needs an ending.
3. Masculine adjective ending = . **-en**
4. Feminine adjective ending = . **-e**
5. Neuter adjective ending = . **-es**
6. Plural adjective ending = . **-en**
