
# Preterite: -er & -ir verbs

perdí







# Preterite tense: some irregular verbs

**Irregular verbs don't follow the rules.**

**Ver, ir** and **dar** are irregular verbs and don't follow the rules for -ar, -er & -ir verbs.

**ver** = to watch / see

**ir** = to go

**dar** = to give



# Preterite tense: some irregular verbs

## Present

Veo un partido de fútbol.

*I watch a football match.*

Voy al campo.

*I go to the countryside.*

Doy una vuelta en bici.

*I go on a bike ride.*

## Preterite

**Vi** un partido de fútbol.

*I watched a football match.*

**Fui** al campo.

*I went to the countryside.*

**Di** una vuelta en bici.

*I went on a bike ride.*



# Using gustar-type verbs in the preterite

## singular

The subject of the sentence is “the culture”.

Me gustó **la** cultura.

*I liked the culture. / The culture pleased **me**.*

Le gustó **el** ambiente.

*He liked the atmosphere. / The atmosphere pleased **him**.*

When the subject of a gustar-type verb is singular (i.e. s/he, it), the verb ending is **-ó**.

When the subject of a gustar-type verb is plural (i.e. they), the verb ending is **-aron**.

## plural

The subject of the sentence is “the views”.

Me gustaron **las** vistas.

*I liked the views. / The views pleased **me**.*

Le gustaron **los** monumentos.

*He liked the monuments. / The monuments pleased **him**.*
