Writing your newspaper report starters 1:

Headline for your news item - think about words that get the main parts of your issue across to your audience.

The Leader - one or two sentences that give the basic facts about your project and the change or improvement you wanted to make.



Writing your newspaper report starters 2:

You might like to include a photo as a piece of evidence.

The Story - one or two short paragraphs describing what action you took:

Explain how you feel your action made a difference.

Describe what changes you might make next time.

Ending - a final sentence with a summary or statement that gives your sense of the story.
