#### Introduction to the lesson

In this lesson, we are going to be building sentences for a weather forecast.

We will look at days of the week, different weather types and different things you may need in each weather condition.

We will then build sentences and practise reading them before recording them on camera.



# Days of the week

To begin this lesson, we will be sequencing the days of the week.

When we listen to the weather forecast, we want to know what the weather will be like on different days so we can plan activities around this.

Write down all of the days of the week and cut them out so you can order them.

#### The weather


Next we will look at pictures of different types of weather.

Discuss each weather type. Ask the learner questions about this weather. What do you like to do when it is sunny?



If it is raining you will need an umbrella.


If it is sunny you will need to drink plenty of water and you will need sun cream.

Discuss the pictures on the next page. When will you need them?





### Making the weather forecast

When you have completed your weather forecast for as many days as you like, you can record the forecast for family and friends.

Start by introducing yourself. 'Hello, my name is Leanne and this is the weather forecast for this week.'

Read your sentences and show pictures to the camera.



### Now it's time to complete the activity

#### Weather forecast

- Write and sequence the days of the week.
- Draw the different weather types onto paper and cut them out.
- Draw and write the words for different things you will need for different weather types.
- Choose a day of the week, a weather type and something you will need.
- Put the words in order and practice saying the sentence.
- Continue for as many days as you like.
- Use a video recording device to record your weather forecast.



#### Make it easier

# Add pictures or symbols to the word bank to support the learner.

Use resources from around the home.

#### Make it harder

Create a weather forecast to match the weather in your area.

Ask the learner what they will need in different weather conditions.

Reduce the support given.

#### **More ideas**

Observe how accurate your weather forecast was.

Add another section giving ideas for activities for this weather type.

Show your weather forecast to family and friends.
