- *Jane first sees this country hall when it is covered in darkness.*
- *Indeed, Jane claims that the dark corridors of Thornfield belong ‘in some Bluebeard’s castle.’*
- *The mystery around Mr Rochester is further emphasised by a number of unanswered questions about this character.*
- *Brontë further creates a tense atmosphere through describing an eerie laugh ringing through the dark corridors of Thornfield.*
