#### Introduction to the lesson

In this lesson we are going to look at animals from different countries around the world.

We will follow the instructions to build a sentence, then learn the sentence before writing it down.





This is a photo of Kenya in Africa. What animal can you see?





What are the elephants doing?





Where are the elephants walking?





Do you remember where in the world they are from?



#### Learn and write a sentence

Now it is time to learn your sentence before writing it down.

This is how you will read the sentence.

'The elephants are walking by the river in Africa'.







This is a photo of Bangladesh in South Asia. What animal can you see?





What is the tiger doing?



Where is the tiger lying down?





Do you remember where in the world they are from?





#### Learn and write a sentence

Now it is time to learn your sentence before writing it down.

This is how you will read the sentence.

'The tiger is lying down on the grass in South Asia.'





This is a photo of Australia. What animal can you see?





What is the koala bear doing?





Where is the koala bear sitting?





Do you remember where in the world they are from?





#### Learn and write a sentence

Now it is time to learn your sentence before writing it down.

This is how you will read the sentence.

'The koala bear is sitting in a tree in Australia.'







This is a photo of Antarctica. What animal can you see?



What are the penguins doing?







Where are the penguins cuddling?





Do you remember where in the world they are from?



#### Learn and write a sentence

Now it is time to learn your sentence before writing it down.

This is how you will read the sentence.

'The penguins are cuddling in the snow in Antarctica.'





# Now it's time to complete the activity

#### **Descriptive writing**

- Work through the step by step instructions and answer the questions.
- Use the symbols to support the sentence structure.
- Once your sentence is complete, practise saying the sentence.
- Use my turn your turn so the learner can hear you say the sentence first.
- Now you can write your sentence onto paper.



#### Make it easier

Cut the symbols or draw them so the learner can order them to create their sentence.

Adults can scribe or write alongside the learner.

#### Make it harder

Add new images of animals in their environments. Ask the learner to research to find the answers.

Reduce the support given.

#### **More ideas**

Look out of the window.
Can you build a sentence about what you can see?
e.g. I can see... a big, red car. The tree is... big and green.
