

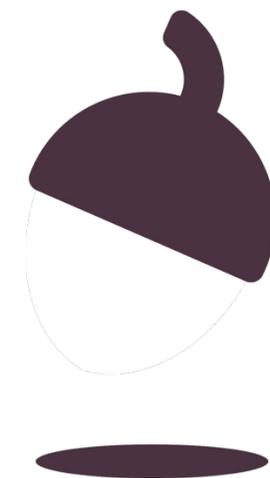

# Querer (to want, wanting)

To say “I want” in Spanish, use Quiero

To say “You want” in Spanish, use Quieres

To say “He/she wants” in Spanish, use Quiere



# Este/Esta

The word for 'this' in Spanish depends on whether the noun it is referring to is masculine or feminine.

## Compare:

Quiero este vestido

**I want this dress**

Quiero esta camiseta

**I want this T-shirt**

*el vestido* is a masculine noun.  
Therefore, we need to use 'este'.

*la camiseta* is a feminine noun.  
Therefore, we need to use 'esta'.



# Estos/Estas

The word for 'these' in Spanish depends on whether the noun it is referring to is masculine or feminine (the noun is in the plural).

## Compare:

Quiero estos zapatos

**I want these shoes**

Quiero estas camisetas

**I want these t-shirts**



## Summary

1. To say 'this' in Spanish, use the words 'este/esta'
2. The adjective 'this' depends on whether the noun they are describing is masculine or feminine.
3. 'Este vestido' means 'this dress'
4. To say 'these' in Spanish, use the words 'estos/estas'
5. Translate: "I want these shoes" Quiero estos zapatos
