





Third person **singular (s/he, it)**

Remove the ending and add new ending:

-ar verbs (recaudar)

Recauda fondos.

s/he, it raises (is raising) funds.

-er/ir verbs (unir)

Une a la gente.

S/he, it unites (is uniting)  
people.

Third person **plural (they)**

Recaudan fondos.

They raise (are raising) funds.

Unen a la gente.

They unite (are uniting)  
people.
