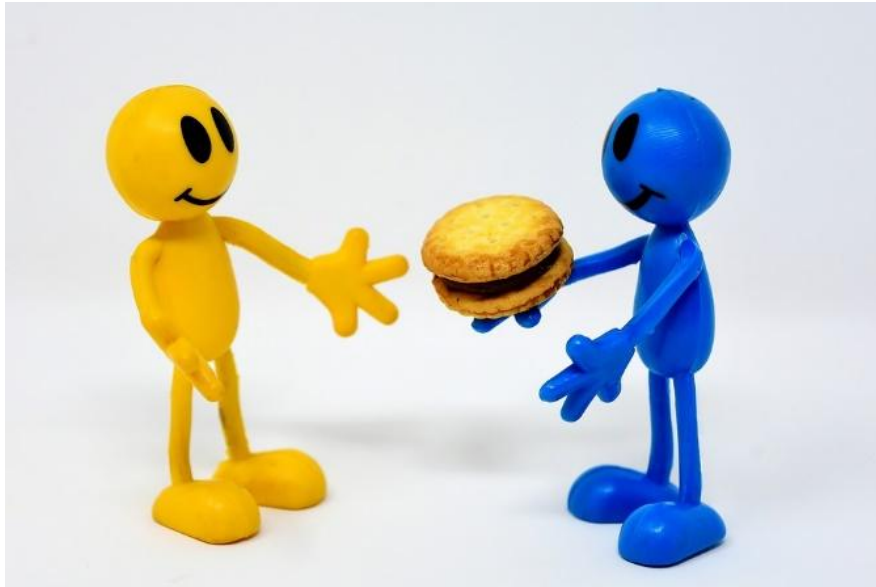

Using gustar-type verbs with nouns

singular

The subject of the sentence is "the culture".

Me gust**a** **la** cultura.

*I like the culture. / The culture **is** pleasing to me.*

Me gust**a** **el** idioma.

*I like the language. / The language **is** pleasing to me.*

plural

The subject of the sentence is "the views".

Me gusta**n** **las** vistas.

*I like the views. / The views **are** pleasing to me.*

Me gusta**n** **los** paisajes.

*I like the landscapes. / The landscapes **are** pleasing to me.*

When the subject of a Gustar-type verb is plural (i.e. they), the verb ending is also plural (**-n**)



Using gustar-type verbs with nouns

Other verbs that work like gustar include:

encantar *to love*

interesar *to be interested in*

chiflar *to love (colloquial)*

fascinar *to be fascinated about*



Using gustar-type verbs with verbs

Me gusta **visitar** monumentos.

I like to visit monuments. / I like visiting monuments.

Me gusta **aprender** idiomas.

I like to learn languages. / I like learning languages.

Me gusta **vivir** nuevas experiencias.

I like to live new experiences. / I like living new experiences.

Sentences with Gustar-type verbs are **always** followed by the **infinitive** form of the verb.

Spanish
infinitives end in
-ar, **-er** and **-ir**.
