



The conditional

The conditional is used to say what you would/could/should do. It allows you to express your hopes and dreams.

Today we will be looking at **2 structures** which both mean **would like** and both need an **infinitive** at the **END** of the sentence.

Ichmöchte Federball spielen

Ichwürde gern Mitglied einer Mannschaft(sein.) I would like to play badminton.

I would like to be a member of a team.


Infinitives end in **en**, this is how you would find the word in the dictionary.

For example:
