Used to express future ideas

When these are followed by another verb, it needs to be an **infinitive**.

## En el futuro

Me gustaría **aprobar** mis exámenes. I would like **to pass** my exams.

Quiero **sacar** buenas notas. I want **to get** good grades.

Espero **hacer** formación profesional I hope **to do** vocational training.



**voy a**

I go to (a place)

### Present tense

Voy **a l** trabajo. (a + el)

(I go to work)

Voy **a la** tienda.

( I go to the shop)

Voy **a los** Estados Unidos.

(I'm going to the USA)

**voy a + infinitive**

I am going to...

### Near future

Voy a **aprender** a conducir.

(I am going to learn to drive)

Voy a **casarme**.

(I am going to get married)

Voy a **tener** dos hijos.

(I am going to have two children)



# Voy a or voy a + infinitive?

1 Mañana		Tomorrow I'm going to learn to drive.
2 Normalmente		Normally I go to work at 8 o'clock.
3 Creo que		I'm going to Puerto Rico.
4 A veces		Sometimes I go to the shop.
5 Este sábado		This Saturday I'm going to study.
6 En el futuro		In the future I'm going to get married.



# Two verb structures

1. When you put two verbs together, the <sup>second</sup> verb must be an infinitive.
2. *Quiero* means I want.
3. *Espero* means I hope.
4. The verb **to drive** is **conducir** \_\_\_\_\_.
5. *Sacar buenas notas* means to get good grades \_\_\_\_\_
