# Saying what I and you do with -ar verbs

## 1st and 2nd person singular

Many Spanish infinitives end in **-ar**.

The verb ending changes depending on who the verb refers to.

Ejemplo:

Escucho **o** música.                      **I** listen to music.

Escuchas **as** música.                      **You** listen to music.

To mean 'I', remove **-ar** from the infinitive and add **-o**.

To mean 'you', remove **-ar** from the infinitive and add **-as**.

Escuchar                       Escucho **o**



# Saying what s/he does with -ar verbs

## 3rd person singular

The same rule applies...

Ejemplo:

Bail**a** salsa.

**S/he** dances salsa.

To mean 's/he' with an **-ar** verb, remove -ar and add **-a**.

Bail  Bail**a**



# Yes/No questions

In Spanish, change a statement into a question by raising your **1. voice** at the end:

**Statement**

Eres alegre. **2. You are** cheerful.

**Question**

¿Eres alegre? **3. Are you** cheerful?

In Spanish, we pay attention to the **4. question mark** in writing and the **5. intonation** in speaking to know whether it is a question.
