 If both clauses (head verb and infinitive) are done by the same person, an accusative reflexive pronoun is used.

puer **se** amavit. e.g. 1 The boy loved **himself**.

head verb + accusative + infinitive e.g. 2 puer dixit se amare. **LITERAL:** The boy said himself to love. **OR:** The boy said **THAT he** was loving/ in love. **NOT:** The boy said that he himself was loving/in love.
