Poder

Use a verb infinitive (e.g. decir) after 'poder'.

Remember, the infinitive refers to the *general meaning* of the verb. It often ends in -ar, -er and -ir.

Use the verb 'poder' to say what people can (or are able to) do.

To say 'we can', use '**podemos**':

Podemos decir todo en alemán. **We can** say everything in German.

To say 'you (plural) can', use '**podéis**':

Podéis decir todo en alemán. **You can** say everything in German.

To say 'they can', use '**pueden**':

Pueden decir todo en alemán.

They can say everything in German.



Deber

Use a verb infinitive (e.g. limpiar) after 'poder'.

Remember, the infinitive refers to the **general meaning** of the verb. It often ends in -ar, -er and -ir.

Use the verb 'deber' to talk about obligations (what people must do).

To say 'We must' say '**debemos**':

Debemos limpiar el suelo.

We must clean the floor.

To say 'you (plural) must' say '**debéis**':

Debéis limpiar el suelo.

You must clean the floor.

To say 'they must' say '**deben**':

Deben limpiar el suelo.

They must clean the floor.



Summary

1. The verb ‘pueden’ means ‘they can/are able to’
2. ‘Debéis’ is ‘you (plural) must/have to’
3. Deber and poder must be followed by the infinitive form of the verb.
4. ‘Deben limpiar’ is ‘they should clean’.
5. ‘Podemos terminar’ is ‘we can finish’.
