

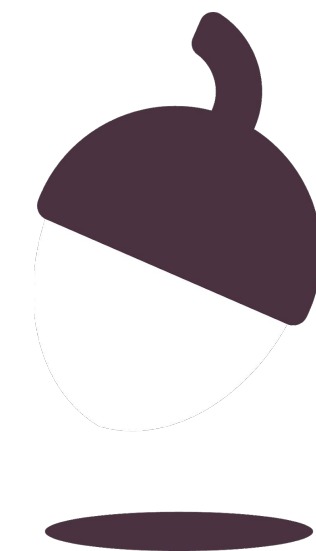

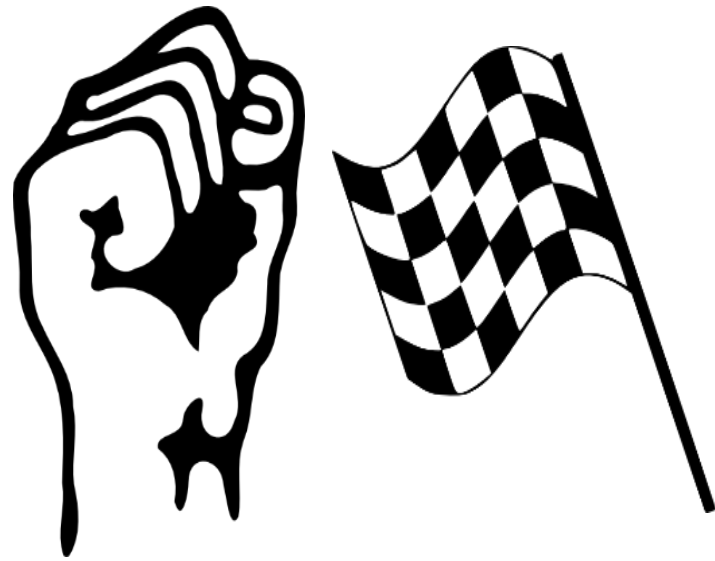

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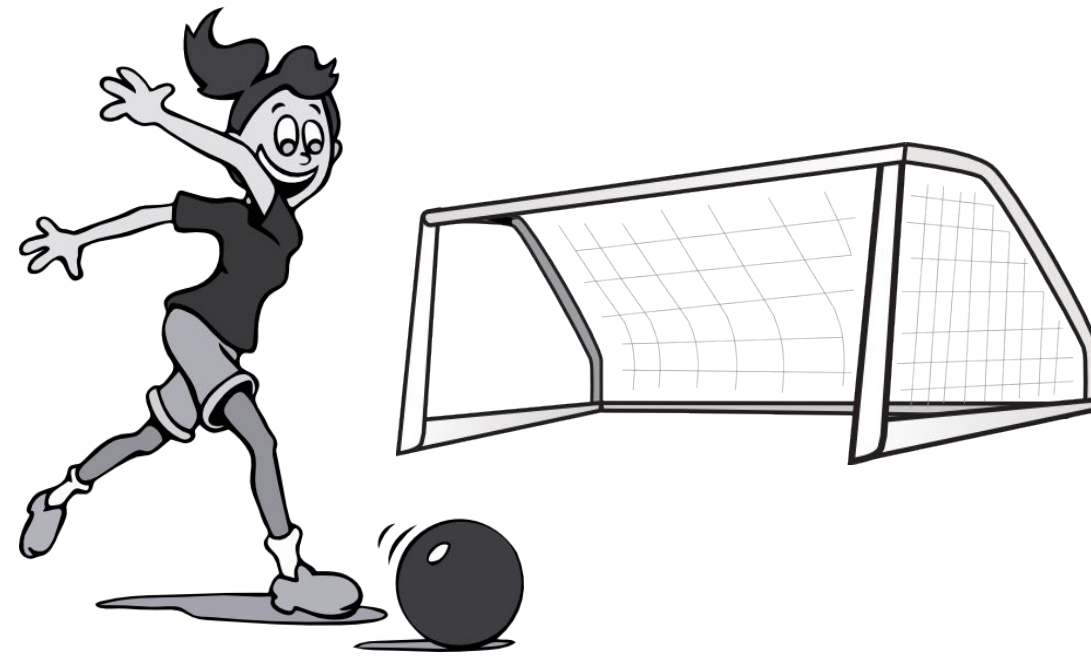

Tener (to have, having)

To say “I have” in Spanish, use **Tengo**

To say “You have” in Spanish, use **Tienes**

To say “He/she has” in Spanish, use **Tiene**



Deber (to have to/must)

To say “I must” in Spanish, use **Debo**

To say “You must” in Spanish, use **Debes**

To say “He/she must” in Spanish, use **Debe**



Poder (to able to/can)

To say “I can” in Spanish, use **Puedo**

To say “You can” in Spanish, use **Puedes**

To say “He/she can” in Spanish, use **Puede**



Este/Esta

The word for 'this' in Spanish depends on whether the noun it is referring to is masculine or feminine.

Compare:

Quiero este vestido

I want this dress

Quiero esta camiseta

I want this T-shirt

el vestido is a masculine noun.
Therefore, we need to use 'este'.

la camiseta is a feminine noun.
Therefore, we need to use 'esta'.



Summary

1. To say 'this' in Spanish, use the words 'este/esta'
2. The adjective 'this' depends on whether the noun they are describing is masculine or feminine.
3. 'Puedo' means 'I can'
4. To say 's/he can' in Spanish, say 'puede'
5. Translate: "I should wear these trousers" Debo llevar estos
pantalones
