Present tense

-ir verbs: 1st person singular ('l' form)

To talk about **'I'** with an action **you do now**, remove –ir and add –**o**.

Compartir — Comparto
Interrumpir — Interrumpo

Elegir Salir El**i**go Sal**g**o



Present tense

-ir verbs: 2nd person singular ('you' form)

To talk about 'you' with an action you do now, remove –ir and add –es.

Compartes Compartir

Interrumpir Interrumpes

Elegir Eliges



Preterite tense

-ir verbs: 1st person singular ('I' form)

To talk about 'I' with an action completed in the past,

remove –er and add –í.

Subir

Describ**ir**

Subí

Describií

Notice the stress on the final -í.

This **past** tense is called the 'preterite'.



Preterite tense

-er verbs: 2nd person singular ('you' form)

To talk about **'you'** with an action **completed in the past**, remove –er and add **-iste**.

Subir Subiste

Interrumpir ------ Interrumpiste
