

## Preterite tense -ar verbs: 2nd person singular & plural

Spanish uses different verb endings for **tú** (one 'you') and **vosotros** (more than one 'you').

Tú

Esper**aste**. You wait**ed.** / Did you wait?

Vosotros/as

Esper**asteis.** 

The verb endings also change in English!

You wait**ed**.
(More than one)

To refer to 'you' singular in the *preterite*, add the verb ending **-aste** to the stem.

To refer to 'you' plural in the *preterite*, add the verb ending *-asteis* to the stem.

ayudar —— ayudaste —— ayudasteis

alquilar alquilaste alquilasteis



## Preterite tense -er & -ir verbs: 2nd person singular & plural

Perdiste. You lost. / Did you lose?

Descubriste. You lost. / Did you lose?

Descubriste. You lost. / Did you lose?

Descubristeis. You discovered. / Did you lose?

To refer to 'you' singular with -ar verbs, add the verb ending -iste to the stem.

To refer to 'you' plural with -er & -ir verb, add the verb ending -isteis to the stem.

volver — volviste — volvisteis
abrir — abriste — abristeis



### Respuestas

- Spanish uses different verb endings for tú (one 'you') and vosotros (more than one 'you').

- 2. To refer to 'you' singular' in the *preterite with -ar* verbs, add the verb ending -aste to the stem.
- 3. 'Pasasteis' referes to 'you' (one person) OR 'vosotros' (more than one 'you').
- 4. To refer to 'you' singular' in the *preterite with -er and -ir verbs*, add the verb ending \_ -iste \_ to the stem.
- 5. Did you travel? = ¿Viajaste?
