Ante-penultimate Syllable Stress

If the stress is on the ante-penultimate syllable (the third-to-last syllable) there will ALWAYS be an accent.

The perfect tense

This week I have read the news every day.

This week I have taken lots of photos.

The week is ongoing



Forming the perfect tense in Spanish

He escuchado	I have listened
Has escuchado	You have listened (Have you listened?)
Ha escuchado	He/she has listened



Forming the perfect tense in Spanish

He compartido	I have shared
Has compartido	You have shared (Have you shared?)
Ha compartido	He/she has shared



The irregulars in the perfect tense

Just like in English, there are irregular past participles in Spanish.

If 'visto' comes from 'ver' = to see

then, 'he visto' = 'I have seen'

If 'hecho' comes from 'hacer' = to do/make

then, 'ella ha hecho' = 'she has done/made'

If 'roto' comes from 'romper' = to break

then, '¿has roto ...' = 'have you broken ...'



The regulars in the perfect tense

Nevertheless, in Spanish the general rule for forming the 'past participle' is that **AR** verbs end in **'ado'** and **ER/IR** verbs end in **'ido'**

escuch<u>ado</u>

acab<u>ado</u>

descarg<u>ado</u>

compart<u>ido</u>

Summary: use of the perfect tense

- 1. The past participle in Spanish ends in <u>'ado'</u> for AR verbs and <u>'ido'</u> for ER/IR verbs.
- 2. 'He' refers to '<u>l'</u> and means '<u>l have'</u> in English in the perfect tense.
- 3. 'Ha' refers to 'he/she' and means 'he/she has' in English in the perfect tense.
- 4. 'Have you ever seen' in Spanish is '¿Alguna vez has visto?'
