

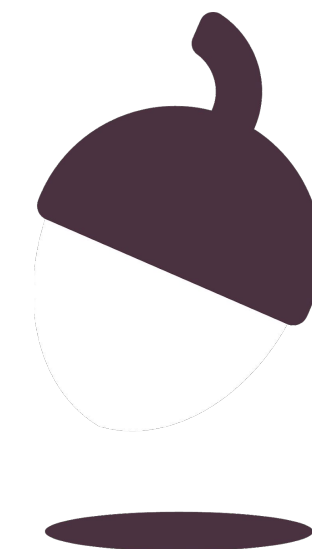

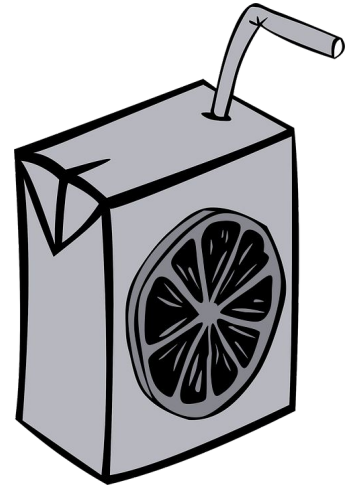

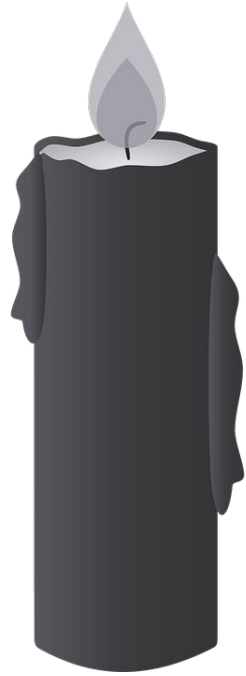

# Using the pronoun “se”

Use **se** to talk about a person or object without making mention of who is performing the action. **Se** is always followed by a third person singular, or third person plural verb.



A candle is lit for the festival.

**Se enciende** una vela para la fiesta



If you are talking about a plural object, the verb must be plural too!

Figures are built for Las Fallas.

**Se construyen** figuras para Las Fallas.

se lanza un huevo
