



We use the perfect tense to describe things that happened in the past.

ich **habe**

du **hast**

er/sie/es **hat**

wir **haben**

ihr **habt**

sie **haben**



past participle  
at the end of

# Forming a past participle in German:

<b><i>weak verbs (regular)</i></b>	<b><i>strong verbs (irregular)</i></b>
<p><u>STEP 1:</u> Look at the infinitive and take off the “-en”</p> <p><i>kaufen</i> → <i>kauf</i></p> <p><u>STEP 2:</u> Now add a “ge” at the front and a “t” at the end</p> <p><b><i>gekauft</i></b></p>	<p><u>STEP 1:</u> Look at the infinitive and take off the “-en”</p> <p><i>tragen</i> → <i>trag</i></p> <p><u>STEP 2:</u> Now add a “ge” at the front and a “en” at the end</p> <p><b><i>getragen</i></b></p>

tragen






To help you remember the word order in the perfect tense in German, think of: S - H - I - P.


