## Activity - Topic Towers

## You will need:

X1 blank topic tower
X5 conversation pieces (for
each topic)
Glue

## What to do:

1)Choose the conversation topic tower
2)Cut out the pieces of conversation
3)Sort the conversation pieces into
order you think they go (1-5)
4)Glue them down
5)See if you can add more blocks by thinking up your own questions and comments to grow the conversation
6)Work through the different topics
7)Try making your own topic towers

## Conversation Games

Microphone game
Choose a topic. Pass a toy microphone around the group. Only when you have the microphone can you say something about that topic.
Show and tell

Ask 1 child in the group to present something important to them e.g. show a photo of their pet. Other children in the group to ask a question e.g. What is the name of your pet, what does it eat, where does it live, how old is it etc.?

Pass the object

Take objects from a bag, and pass them 1 by 1 around the group - each person must say something about that object.
Staying in the category
Play my grandmother went to market / my monster sandwich / I went to the beach and saw etc. Each person adds a relevant item and recalls the ones other people have said e.g. My grandmother went to mark and bought a cake, my grandmother went to market and bought a cake, a pint of milk... etc.

## Top Tips

## Strategies

- When the child changes the subject unexpectedly, you can say something like "Wait a minute! We were talking about pizza. You changed the topic."
- Give them a choice "Are we talking about pizza or what we did at the weekend".
- Provide scaffolding; You can repeat questions or remind a child "I was asking about..." or "I'm interested in knowing more about..." to get back to the topic of conversation.
- Model being a good conversational partner by responding appropriately to children's comments and questions and demonstrating active listening when they engage you in conversation
- Take advantage of ALL times of the day - snack and lunch are great times to have informal conversations with one or a small group of children.
