Cuando cuentes cuentos, cuidado. Cuenta cuantos cuentos cuentas, cuando cuentes cuentos.



Use of 1st person: present and near future tense

To talk about 'I' with an action **you do now**, remove the infinitive ending (AR/ER/IR) and add **-o**.



To talk about 'I' with an action you are going to do, use 'voy + a + infinitive'



The personal 'a'

A personal 'a' is needed when the object of a verb is a known or

identified person or animal.

Cuido a mi hermano menor.

I look after my younger brother.

We don't need to translate the 'a'.

We don't need the personal 'a' when the person isn't identified yet.

Busco un amigo.

I'm looking for a friend.

Busco a mi amigo.

I'm looking for my friend.



Use of personal 'a' VS. 'a' meaning 'to'

We also use the word 'a' to mean 'to'.

Compare:

Personal 'a' 'to'

Acompaño ami tía la tienda.

I accompany my aunt to the shop.

Acompaño a mi abuelo al supermercado.

Remember, when 'a' is followed by 'el" in a sentence, they join together to become 'al'.

I accompany my grandfather to the supermarket.
