Conjugating 'jouer' in the present tense



Je	jou	e	I play / am playing
Tu	jou	es	You play / are playing
Il	jou	e	He plays / is playing
Elle	jou	e	She plays / is playing
On	jou	e	We (general) play / are playing
Nous	jou	ons	We play / are playing
Vous	jou	ez	You (plural) play / are playing
Ils	jou	ent	They play / are playing
Elles	jou	ent	They (female) play / are playing



Conjugating 'faire' in the present tense



Je	fai s	I do / am doing
Tu	fai s	You do / are doing
Il	fai t	He does / is doing
Elle	fai t	She does / is doing
On	fai t	We (general) do / are doing
Nous	fai sons	We do / are doing
Vous	fai tes	You (plural) do / are doing
Ils	font	They do / are doing
Elles	font	They (female) do / are doing



Talking about sports

1. *jouer* = ^{to play / playing}
2. It's a ^{regular -ER} verb.
3. The endings in the present tense are :
 e es e ons ez ent
4. *faire* = ^{to do / doing}
5. It's an ^{an irregular -re} verb.
6. The conjugation for *faire* is: ^{fais fais fait faisons faites font}
