

**jouer** - to play

**Je joue** = I play



to talk about sports that I play

**faire** - to do

**Je fais** = I do / I go to



to talk about sports/ activities that I do or go to





If the sport is masculine, we say: *je fais du*

e.g. *Je fais du patinage*

If the sport is feminine, we say: *je fais de la*

e.g. *Je fais de la natation*

If the sport begins with a vowel, we say: *je fais de l'*

e.g. *Je fais de l'équitation*

If the sport is plural, we say: *je fais des*

e.g. *Je fais des randonnées*



# Talking about sports

1. The phrase '*je joue*' means = I play
2. I use '*je joue*' for sports = I play in a team/ with a ball
3. The phrase '*je fais*' means = I do/ I go to
4. I use '*je fais*' for sports = that I do/ go to and don't involve a ball
5. '*Je fais*' is followed by = du / de la / de l' / des + activity
6. It changes depending on whether.....  
the activity is masc/ fem/ vowel/ pl
