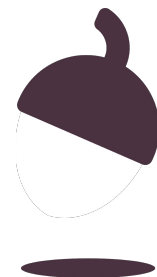

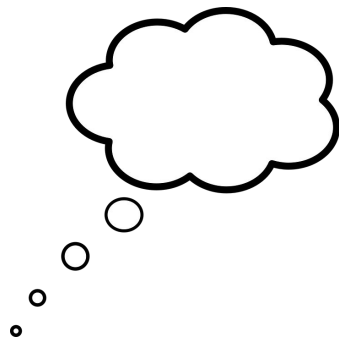

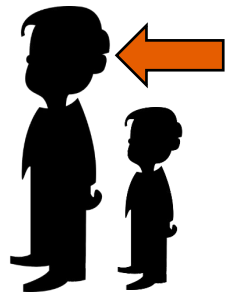

| m'installer avec mon copain/ma copine | to move in with my boy/girlfriend           |

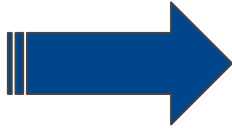


Remember, the infinitive can also be translated by the gerund. Example: faire = to do/doing



# Using pour + the infinitive

**J'irai** à l'université **pour**  
**continuer** mes études.



**I will go** to university **(in**  
**order) to continue** my studies.



**'Pour'** can mean **'in order to'**. It can be used to add clarification to our sentences. **'Pour'** is followed by the **infinitive**.



# Using pour + the infinitive

**J'irai** à l'université **pour continuer** mes études.



**I will go** to university **(in order) to continue** my studies.

**'Pour'** can mean **'(in order)to'**.

It is followed by **the infinitive**.

We can use the word **'pour'** to add clarification to our sentences.

In these examples, the **first event is expressed using the simple future**, and the **second event is expressed after the term 'pour', in the infinitive form**.
