# Me gustaría VS. me gusta

## Me gusta

Use me gusta to talk about things **you like in general.**

### Me gusta trabajar en Argentina

*I like working in Argentina. /  
working in Argentina **pleases** me.*

Remember that after gustar-type verbs we use the **infinitive** form of the verb.

## Me gustaría

Use '**me gustaría**' to express something that **you would like / would like to do.**

### Me gustaría trabajar en Argentina.

*I would like to work in Argentina./  
Working in Argentina **would please** me.*

'Me gustaría' is the conditional tense of 'gustar'.

# Saying what time things happen - 24 hour clock

a la una

at one am

a la dos, a las tres

at 02:00 (two am), at 03:00 (three am)

a las catorce

at 14:00 (two pm)

The 24-hour clock just uses numbers (and not quarter or half)

a las trece cero ocho

at 13:08

a las trece quince

at 13:15

a las trece treinta

at 13:30



# 24 hour clock

If you are travelling, you might hear announcements in airports or stations using the 24-hour clock:

El avión **con destino a** Ibiza sale **a las quince cero dos**

The plane **to** Ibiza leaves **at 15:02** (two minutes past three)

Hay **un retraso** de cinco horas.

There is a five hour **delay**.
